Take time to sharpen the saw

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#### Dear church leader:

Many GC2 equipper readers lead congregations and ministries within congregations. Thanks for your labor of love! What you are doing is vital kingdom-building work that is helping people discover, embrace and participate actively in the love and life of our Triune God. What a blessing! And what a challenge.

One of your challenges as a pastor or ministry leader is seeing that your ministry leaders and workers are equipped for active and skillful participation in Jesus' disciplemaking ministry. Equipping (training) is an often over-looked priority because we all tend to be busy "doing ministry." But know this: equipping is vital for growth in effectiveness. Think of it as "sharpening the saw."

In "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People" Steve Covey invites us to envision a walk in the woods. There we come upon a man working feverishly to saw down a big tree. He is clearly exhausted from this work. And wanting to help, we suggest he take a break to sharpen his saw. We are surprised when he replies, "I don't have time to sharpen my saw, I'm too busy sawing."

Covey says that one of the routine habits of highly effective people is occasionally taking time away from the work of sawing in order to sharpen the saw. Doing so saves time and energy in the end, thus adding to overall effectiveness.

And so it is in ministry leadership. It's important that we take time away from routine (and necessary) ministry tasks for "saw sharpening."

I encourage you to do so in 2008. Take time to equip your ministry leaders and workers. This issue of GC2 equipper shares ideas, insights and resources to help you do that.

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# Q: How do I get my ministry workers interested in being equipped?

A: Consider some advice from Fred Smith Sr.

In "Training the Core Workers," (the full article may be purchased at <a href="https://www.buildingchurchleaders.com">www.buildingchurchleaders.com</a>), Smith notes that the key here is personal relationship: "Before any of us can be trained, we need to believe somebody wants us to do well, believes in us, likes us, respects us."

Within this relational context Smith offers principles concerning training core ministry workers. Here are two of them:

#### 1. Train strengths, not weaknesses

It's more productive to make what is already strong stronger rather than focusing on overcoming existing weaknesses. As a pastor or ministry leader, point out the strengths of your workers and then offer to get them help to develop those strengths. By taking this positive approach, you provide encouragement that may awaken in that worker a strength they did not know they had.

#### 2. Not everything at once

Ministry workers can make only so much progress at one time. Help them break down the need for growth into small pieces they can handle without feeling overwhelmed. One step at a time.
